WHAT IS CLASSICAL EDUCATION?

Classical education is a centuries old method of teaching that pairs the natural abilities of children with the primary mode of instruction of three stages: grammar, logic, and rhetoric. Every subject, skill, and art is taught from a biblical lens, teaching students to follow Christ in thought, word, and deed.

Grammar (PK-6 Grade)

Young children are particularly gifted in memorization. During these early years, teachers lay a strong foundation in character and virtue formation through Scripture, stories, and the language arts. Students love to memorize at this age and repetition, chanting, and singing help are the keys to opening their minds and imaginations.

Logic (7-9 Grade)

As a child matures from grade seven (7) through nine (9), he is naturally curious, beginning to think logically, and challenge the validity of what they are learning. The Logic phase capitalizes on this natural developmental stage teaching students to think critically and reason well.

Rhetoric (10-12 Grade)

Once a student obtains a knowledge of the facts (grammar) and develops the skills necessary to arrange those facts into arguments (logic), he can develop a clear, articulate point of view that is easily communicated to others (rhetoric). The Rhetoric phase helps students engage with the Great Tradition through Socratic teaching, debates, and round table discussions.

The Trivium is built on the foundation of the cardinal virtues of prudence, courage, temperance, and fortitude and the Christian virtues of faith, hope, and love. These are fostered through mentorship, discipleship, independence, freedom, and responsibility in the learning process. The work of Covenant Academy is much more than an educational service; it's a partnership that supports the work of the family and the church as they prepare the child to serve the community.
